Sovereignty of God

Read Isaiah 46:9-10

"I AM" - two of the smallest words in the English language and yet they encapsulate the sovereignty of God as He reveals Himself to us throughout the Bible by names that describe His very character. It is as Creator that His sovereignty begins for us (Gen 1:2). His creation includes all the things that were created on the earth, such as the inhabitants of the earth and all the things in the skies and heavens above.

Submission to God and His sovereign authority is a choice that He has given each of us to make. Probably, most of us have heard some child or teenager say to someone who is not their parent: "You're not the boss of me." We may not put it in those terms, but we can live our lives in such a way that it reflects that attitude. In doing so, we live as though we ignore that God exists or we feel that He exists only to assist us through life "as needed." Attitudes such as these (or similar ones) assume that we have control over our day-to-day lives. AP reporter Jack Zavada says, "God" is not bound or limited by the dictates of His created beings." Until we understand and acknowledge who God is and that He is the rewarder of those who diligently seek Him through faith in His Son, Jesus Christ (Heb 11:6), we will never know the peace, the love, and the fulfillment of the relationship offered to us at the point of creation by our Almighty Sovereign God.
